Prevent is a government strategy designed to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorist or extremist causes.

How the Prevent strategy applies to us?

From July 2015 the staff in all schools have a duty to safeguard you from radicalisation and extremism.

This means that we have a responsibility to protect you from extremist and violent views the same way that we protect you from drugs or violence.

The Brookfield School provides a safe place for you to discuss these issues so that you can protect yourself.

Being part of Britain

Rules & Laws


You are taught why we have laws, how they govern and protect us and what happens when these laws are broken.
